TRAINING FOR SHGs of KOLORIANG AT ASHA

ASHA

Association for Social Human Advancement {ASHA} aims at women empowerment and rights-based activities by catering to the marginalized and the needy in the far flung villages of Arunachal Pradesh. In the past one decade, ASHA has formed different Self Help Groups by focusing on Self- Sustainability, Self-Reliance, Gender-Equality and Gender-Justice. In addition, ASHA enhances and conducts several training Programs for SHG women to participate in





political activities, and to provide leadership at various levels.



Taking into consideration the requests received, ASHA provided need-based trainings for 15 SHG animators and members from Koloriang {Arunachal Pradesh} in collaboration with JUST Agartala, SHG Federation, Belbari, ICAR, Lembucherra and Agricultural College of Tripura. Resource persons from these organizations through their professional and scientific approach trained them, dealing with areas such as: Gender-equality, Gender-justice for SHG women, rights-based leadership, Mushroom cultivation, livestock management, horticulture, honey bee keeping & Vermin compose.



This exposure visit of SHG women of Koloriang was an eye opener for each of them. In fact, most of them are coming out of their home town for the first time. Hence it has been an enriching experience which they would actualize it; and I am sure that they would impart their knowledge with other SHG members at Koloraing in Kurung Kumey District of Arunachal Pradesh. ASHA honestly acknowledges the immense contribution of Mr. Kundalai Francis, the president and founder of IVDP, Krishnagiri, Tamil Nadu, who has been an inspiration for SHGs at Koloraing. ASHA will always remain grateful to him, for his constant support and generous contribution.

MY FIRST IMPRESSION OF BARUNGA MISSION



With the recent agreement signed between the Diocese of Aizawl {Barak Valley Region} and the Fathers of Holy Cross {Province of Northeast India}, a Holy Cross personnel has been assigned to help the diocese in starting a new seminary-formation program at Tikar Barunga for Barak Valley Deanery. Barunga is situated at the foothills of Jaintia and North Cachar Hills. The weather is fairly cooler as compared to Silchar, the second biggest commercial hub of Assam.

A saying goes: Seeing is believing. Those of our confreres, who had visited me at Barunga, went back home casting their last envious look!! There is a sprawling *arroconut* {kuva / kuwai} plantation and two large "lake-like" ponds teeming with plenty of fish. What more!





Barunga Parish has a co-ed High School with 800 enrolments. Boys' Hostel is attached to the school like any of our conventional mission centre. Religious Sisters of SABS look after the girls' hostel, while they also teach in the school. Pastoral care is a concern as there are 38 villages with a catholic population of about 2,000 to attend to with one elderly priest holding multiple major responsibilities. Khasi and Bangla are the languages used for communication at all levels.

We have not moved to the new seminary campus. There is a lot more to do, such as internal wirings, paintings, room furnishing, drinking water, etc. If all goes well, we hope to move to the new campus by the end of 2022.



Deacon Sharon Piuse CSC was Ordained a priest on Thursday 5th May 2022 at St. Augustine, Church Pulikurumba, Kerala by His Excellency, Mar Joseph Pamplany, Archbishop of the Archeparchy of Tellichery. It was a moment of great joy for the



family of deacon Sharon and for the Congregation of Holy Cross, Province of Northeast India. About 18 Holy Cross priests attended the Ordination Ceremony along with number of other Priests, Religious and Faithful. In his homily, the archbishop exhorted the newly ordained priest to be compassionate while being firmly rooted in the Lord. A felicitation programme was organised soon after the Ordination and the First Mass to congratulate the newly ordained priest.

Sharon joined the Holy Cross formation programme at Sumer in 2011, followed by mission experiences at Good Shepherd Parish, Kathalcherra {Tripura}, and Holy Cross Parish, Koloriang {Arunachal Pradesh}. Then he went on to do his Philosophical studies at Christ King College, Shillong. He entered the Novitiate in 2017 and made his First Profession on 28th May 2018. From 2018 to 2021 he was at Holy Cross Seminary Pune doing his Theology at JDV. He made his Perpetual Profession on 16th October 2021 and was ordained as a deacon on the next day by Most Rev. Lumen Monteiro CSC {Bishop: Diocese of Agartala}.

Sharon spoke to the *WAVES* about his family, childhood and call to Religious Life in Holy Cross.

Waves: Would you mind sharing about your family, childhood-experience, spiritual upbringing, etc?

Sharon CSC: I belong to St. Augustine Church, Pulikurumba, Archdiocese of Tellichery, Kerala. I have one brother and one sister. My parents brought us up in Catholic spirituality. My family is very pious and spiritual, where prayer takes precedence over everything else.

Daily family prayer was compulsory and there was no exemption from it. Attending mass on Sundays was mandatory. My siblings and I were faithful to it. Regular Sunday catechism classes moulded my spiritual life.







Waves: What drew you to becoming a religious in Holy Cross?



Sharon, CSC: I came to know about Holy Cross through my cousin, Fr. Thomas John, CSC, who is a Holy Cross priest. Through his instrumentality, Т joined the Congregation. During the years of formation, I was attracted to follow the charism and spirituality of Fr. Basil Moreau and prepared myself, mentally,

emotionally, spiritually, and physically to be a missionary priest in Holy cross. My stay in the formation houses and parishes in the North East as part of my formative years brought me closer to the life and ministry of Holy Cross Priests. I was also attracted to the spirituality of St. Brother Andre Bessette, CSC. I am certain that it is the Lord who drew me closer to Holy Cross and it's mission.

Waves: What drew you to the missions in the Northeast India?

<u>Sharon, CSC</u>: The experiences of visiting Holy Cross missions in different parts of North East, gave me an insight into the life and ministry in the missions. It was challenging but fulfilling and rewarding. Being part of it helped me to reflect on my own life and my call to be a missionary in North East. It also helped me to recognize what God wants me to be and through the Congregation of Holy Cross. So, I could say with confidence that it is not I who chose but God chose me {Jn. 15:16}to be a Holy Cross Missionary.

Fr. Lourthuswamy, CSC (1954 – 2022)

A Joyful Holy Cross Missionary

Rev. Fr. Lourdhusamy, CSC, was born in Rangoon, Burma, to Lt. Yagammal and Lt. Savarimuthu on April 26, 1954, as the second of seven children. Josephine Mary is his elder sister. His younger sisters are Viyagula Mary, Victoria Mary and Packya Mary. Mr. Kulandai Sesu and Mr. Amalraj are his younger brothers.

His journey in Holy Cross began with Lt. Fr. Philip Payant CSC. He brought him to Holy Cross Seminary at Trichy, Tamil Nadu, where he completed his PUC and moved to Bangalore to continue his Bachelor's Degree in History. After a successful year of Novitiate, Fr. Lourthu made his First Profession in the Congregation of Holy Cross on May 30, 1977, at Yercaud in Tamil Nadu. He then went to Pune for his Philosophy and Theology degrees and made his Final commitment to the family of Holy Cross on July 29, 1983, in Holy Cross Seminary, Pune, Maharashtra. Subsequently, he was Ordained a



Priest at Somarasampetai, Trichy, Tamil Nadu on May 5, 1984.

His missionary journey in Holy Cross began with his first appointment as an associate pastor at Kathalcherra in October 1984. In September 1988, he was installed as the parish priest of the same parish and remained there until October 1991. In November 1991, he was elected as the Assistant Provincial and shouldered the leadership of North East India's missions. After his term as Assistant Provincial in 1994, he went to the US for his updates. In June 1996, he returned to the North East to shoulder the responsibility as the parish priest of Depacherra, where he served seven long years. During this long tenure, he faced many challenges at the Depacherra mission, like theft and other political unrest including an attempt to ambush the vehicle in which he and other co-missionary team members were travelling. Fr. Lourthu cherished this beautiful mission at Depacherra with great care.

After serving as the principal of Holy Cross School, Panisagar, he was appointed as the parish priest of Kumarghat in April 2004 where he served the next three years. In July 2007 he was back to Kathalcherra as parish priest till he retired due to ill health in 2012. From then on, he was a resident priest at Andre Home, Agartala, till the good Lord called him to his eternal reward on April 16, 2022. Incidentally this was ten days before his 68th birthday.

Fr. Lourthu was a great missionary, and he opted to work in the missions of North East India all along his life. He was a very affectionate and passionate pastor. He was an ardent, faithful religious of Holy Cross. He possessed a generous heart, especially for the children. He was a cheerful person with a positive attitude and an inspiration to many of Holy Cross religious. His passing to eternal bliss saddens us. But we celebrate his life here on earth, especially his missionary zeal and love for the people he
