members. We were contented





encouraged the students with his words of wisdom to be good leaders. Different dances and mass drills performed by the students added colour to the entire program.




# GOOD SHEPHERD PARISH, KATHALCHERRA

teachers were welcomed by the management and introduced to the students in the assembly.




#### **Teachers' Seminar**

The Province of Northeast India organised a twoweek summer program for eight scholastics from




Pune from 17<sup>th</sup> to 30<sup>th</sup> April '23. It was a much-awaited program for the scholastics to spend time together, to know the Province & its

The program was coordinated by the Formation Coordinator, Fr. Mariaraj I csc.

In the first week, the Scholastics were divided into two groups of four each and sent to different mission centres in Tripura. It was a great experience to have been to the mission centres, meet our confreres, and know more about each centre's activities.

During the Second week, the sessions were given by different resource personnel. The first session was taken by Fr. Mariaraj, CSC, who discussed the Holy Cross Formation worldwide. In the next session, Fr.



Right from the beginning of the Congregation, through the name that it gets from the place it was founded, and the patronage emerged from the church that already existed, the Cross of Christ had a significant place and impact in the life of Basil Moreau, as a Founder. This is also seen in the names of the first four sisters: Leocadie Gascoin - known as Sr. Mary of Seven Dolors, Marie Robineaux - known as Sr. Mary of Calvary, Rene Boutelier - known as Sr. Mary of the Compassion, and Leonie Chapin - known as Sr. Mary of Holy Cross; who professed their Religious Profession, confirming that the Cross of Christ or His Suffering had a place in the heart of our Founder, Basil Moreau. Today, we may think that we got the name of Holy Cross and Our Lady of Seven Sorrows, because it was already there, and also, Moreau named the Sisters with these names as a mere coincidence. Not so, and as Educators in the Faith, we can't conclude thus, for "All things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are called according to his purpose" (Rom 8:28). And this can be seen as our Founder discovered a true meaning of the Cross while enduring numerous difficulties and problems throughout his life. At times, when he found it extremely difficult to bear the hardships, he could solely trust in the Divine Providence. Thus, he always believed and hailed the Cross as the Only Hope.

As Men of Holy Cross, in this 150<sup>th</sup> year of his entry into Eternal Life, and in this fast-changing world, where men and women search for comfort and easy-going life, we are called by our Founder to pause and reflect upon our Consecrated Religious Life ... a life that embraces the Cross and finds meaning in doing so. Therefore, the Cross of Christ, to every member of Holy Cross symbolises hope and the courage to move forward amidst life's challenges. The Cross acts as a Guiding-Light to all of us, leading us from darkness to light, from despair to hope. Again, our Founder, Basil Moreau, calls upon every member of the Congregation to draw inspiration and strength from the Cross as he says: "It is necessary to know the Mystery of the Cross and draw from it the apostolic strength of those generous imitators of Jesus Christ whose life here below was a continuous martyrdom", (CL 11) to be people who are ready to die for Christ and his message.
