Children are gifted with varieties of talents, and those talents must be brought out through competitions and collective efforts. A drawing









MOREAU'S COLUMN

BL. BASIL MOREAU'S UNIQUE VISION OF COMMUNITY – UNION AND COLLABORATION

Fr. Basil Moreau conceived of a congregation where the three societies of priests, brothers and sisters worked in close collaboration with one another. He wished them to be united in life and mission. For Fr. Moreau, their union was "a powerful lever with which to move, direct and sanctify the whole world" (CL #14, 1841). Whenever ecclesial authorities requested him to send missionaries, he would prefer to send members of all three societies together. Fr. Thomas Barrose, CSC, former superior general, rightly observed that for Fr. Moreau, the' kind of union' was more important than the 'fact of the union' of the three societies. He conceived of the three societies as autonomous and standing on an equal pedestal. The three societies together





were to form the congregation's general chapter and take all important decisions together.

What was more progressive and radical for Fr. Moreau was the status he gave to women and lay



religious at a time when these were considered He wanted passive. women religious to have an equal voice with men religious and lay religious (brothers) to have an equal voice with clerical


religious. This was a prophetic vision of the founder who "in the church of his time, should have conceived of the union of the three societies as a single congregation as he did." For him, the union was the fundamental element of the congregation of the Holy Cross. He understood the union of heart, mind, and ministries as the foundation of community life. For him, the importance of union is such that he offered four models for Holy Cross to emulate: the Holy Trinity, the Holy Family, St. Paul's body image, and the Vine and Branches.

Although the dream and vision of Fr. Moreau was to establish a family consisting of the three societies, that was rejected despite his continuous persuasion with the Holy See. Nevertheless, the congregation consisting of laymen and clerical religious was approved, and the vision of fundamental equality for both societies was fulfilled. Constitution #6 of the congregation states that the congregation of Holy Cross is "a religious congregation composed of two distinct societies of clerics and of laymen bound indivisible in one brotherhood." together Fundamentally, we are called to live and work together in the Lord's mission and are united by "a common founder, tradition, rule, government, way of life and mission" (C. #6). As Fr. Claude Grou, CSC, former superior general, said, "This call to unity is a key element of the Speaking of the unique identity of the Holy Cross."

Thomas Barrose, CSC, pointed out that of the many religious institutes founded during the 19th century, there was none like the Holy Cross that was approved by the Holy See as а congregation of societies of cleric and lay

equal footing. As far as Fr. Moreau was concerned, he was ahead of his time. Although the 19th century was witnessed by increasing centralisation of power in civil government and the Church, Basil Moreau insisted on collegial structures by which the most important decisions were to be taken. The systems he introduced were an annual general chapter with broad authority and local chapters with decisionmaking powers. He being the superior general undertook extensive consultation on matters of congregation-wide interest, and in matters of appointment, he only assigned his religious to the more difficult ministries if they responded to the invitation voluntarily.

We are proud of our founder and the legacy that he has left behind. To repeat what Fr. Claude Grou, CSC said, "Our union and collaboration is a gift and a task." From reading the circular letters of the former superiors general, I realised that this task has always been challenging. As we celebrate the 150th entry of our beloved founder into eternal life, it is time for us to seriously reflect and ponder on how to bring this rich gift to fruition. That means making our union a powerful lever to move and sanctify the world. The intimate union should be like the first









Christian community, a spectacle of admiration for others - "See how they love one another." It is in loving one another that our community becomes "a sign in an alienated world: men who have, for the love of the Lord, become closest neighbours, trustworthy friends, brothers" (C. # 42).




