



HOLY CROSS PARISH MAWPAT - AN OVERVIEW



Holy Cross Parish, Mawpat, was erected in 2017. It has completed 5 years, and the Parish has grown wide and vast. It has 31 Catholic villages with 712 families.





UNITS:

The Parish is divided into six units for the convenience of better pastoral care. The monthly liturgical activities are organized on Sundays in these units. On a specified Sunday, people from the villages of these units gather in one village along with the priest. The village leaders themselves organize these gatherings.

THE ASSOCIATIONS:



The associations for men, women, and youth are active, and the programs are conducted throughout the year. The executive committees of these associations have their office bearers and plan out their monthly/yearly programs. They organize Leadership Training, Retreat for the Members, Social Awareness Program, and the like. This year, the Retreat for the Youth will be on 14-15 October, and on 16th October, the Sacrament of Confirmation will be given to the children. Special Catechetical instructions are given to the parish children to have their faith strengthened. At the Diocese level, the Annual Meeting is held once a year.

SMALL CHRISTIAN COMMUNITIES:

Small Christian Communities are organized in the Parish to help the faithful read the Bible, reflect and practice the gospel values. The Annual Meeting of SCCs from 6 Parishes was organized in Mawpat on April 29, 30 & 1st May in Mawpat. More than 200 participants benefitted from it. Fr. Cosmos Jyrwa & Sr. Bansara of the Diocese of Nongstoin were the resource persons.

FAMILY CELL:

The family cell team, under the guidance of the Family Commission of Nongstoin Diocese and Holy Cross Family Ministry, organized different programs in the Parish. The Parish Team has planned for an annual program to be held in different villages of the Parish. This year, Fr. George Jarain, Director of Family Commission, Diocese of Nongstoin, organized a two-day training program, and the Executive Committee members renewed their office tenure for another three years. On 23 - 24, July, the Family Cell Team members organized the training in Nongtynniaw village. About 300 members attended the same.

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL:



Once in three months, the Parish Pastoral Council Meeting is held on the first Saturday. The Church leaders of the villages represent their respective villages. This year, the Parish Pastoral Council had its 2nd meeting on 9th of July and planned activities for the whole year. In 2021, the PPC announced the Annual Eucharistic Procession in the Parish for the next 10 years and will be held in different sub-centers of the Parish. Periodically the Parish Council evaluates and monitors the programs of the Parish. This year the Annual Eucharistic Procession will be held in Langmyndia, one of the remotest villages.

The faithful of the Parish are periodically accompanied in their faith journey, primarily through administering of Sacraments:





SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:

The families are taught the Catechism of the Catholic Church before the child is baptized. In each village, the Church Committee takes the initiative to teach the family members, especially the parents. Last year we had 347 baptisms.

SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION:



Each village conducts catechism classes every Sunday, during which the children are prepared to receive the First Holy Communion. During the yearly retreat for the children, they are instructed more about this Sacrament. They are also taught how to approach the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This year 228 children received their First Holy Communion.

SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION:

The children are prepared to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation every year. They are taught in their villages every Sunday, and an immediate preparation precedes the reception of the Sacrament. This year, they will be confirmed in their faith on 16th Oct.'22.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY:

Every year, the teaching of the Catholic Church on the Sacrament of Matrimony is separately taught to those who are going to get married and to those who are already living together. In the Diocese of Nongstoin, the Family Commission organizes three-day instructional classes on the Sacrament of Matrimony. The couples who are going to get married attend this teaching. Those who will rectify their marriages are called to the Parish separately and are instructed on the Church-Teachings.

THE MAJOR LITURGICAL SERVICES:

Liturgical activities for Christmas, Easter, Parish Feast, and the Days of the different Associations are held at the Mission Centre with the requisite preparation. During the season of Advent and Lent, the Priests go to the villages to bless the faithful through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The Holy Week Liturgy is organized in different villages with the significant participation of the faithful. During the Parish Feast, the Church Leaders {Rangbah Balang} renew their commitment and are felicitated for their dedicated service to the Mission.

VILLAGE-LEVEL ANNUAL MEETING:

in January or
February to
evaluate and



prepare for the New Year. This report is brought to the Parish along with the Financial Statement. In April, the Parish Annual Report is presented at the Parish Pastoral Council Meeting, along with the Financial Statement of the Mission.

EDUCATIONAL MINISTRY:

The Parish manages one Secondary School, 3 Upper Primary Schools and 11 Lower Primary Schools in different villages. The Secondary School in Mawpat has classes from Nursery to Class X, with 371 students. This year the Board Exam Result was much









better than the previous years. The school has secured a 74% result. On 25th Aug.'22, the Child Welfare Office from

Mawkyrwat, organised a training session for the students of our Secondary School in Mawpat. The team trained the students on Posco Act: How to protect themselves from any harassment. Mr. Passah {Director} and Mr. Samuel Lyngdoh were the Resource Persons. The Students took part in the
