Dewormina the Children – A Great Initiative

The National Mass Deworming Programme of the Government of India aims at administering a single dose of Deworming tablet (Albendazole) to all school-going children in the age group of 3 years to 19 years. It is well-known that we need a healthy body to have a healthy mind. Thus, deworming is a viable initiative for our future generations' all-round physical and mental development. The government





executes this programme yearly at a mass scale by leveraging the existing educational infrastructure and training teachers to deliver Deworming medication. Carrying forward this great initiative,



the Govt. of Tripura has organised the MSSSKA or Mukhyamantri Sustha Saisab Sustha Kishore Abhiyan for the last four years. This year, it was held from the 19<sup>th</sup> of September to the 03<sup>rd</sup> of October. Along with this programme, the Govt. clubbed activities like 'Anemia Mukta Bharat (AMB & IFA supplements), Poshan Abhiyan, Td10 and Td16 vaccination, Vitamin A supplementation etc.

Like the previous years, this year, our school took utmost care to ensure that our students benefit from this great initiative. A total of 4213 students received the Albendazole tablets, and 4882 students received the Iron & Folic tablets, thanks to the wholehearted efforts of the management, teaching & non-teaching staff. MSSSKA 5.0 was a great success with Holy Cross School since we ardently believe that – healthy students can surely make healthy future citizens of our country.

The visitation began with Br. Paul visited the Holy Cross Seminary in Pune, where he met with the Province's 17 seminarians and Fr. K.O. Joseph, Assistant Rector. Br. Paul also addressed the seminarians on the "Holy Cross Internationality and Mission" topic and answered their questions.



For the rest of the visit, the General Visitors formed two teams: Br. Paul and Br. Nee Wayoe visited the states of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, and Meghalaya, while Br. Prodip and Fr. Andrew went to Mizoram and Tripura.

Br. Paul and Br. Nee started in Itanagar, where they attended the Episcopal Ordination and Installation of the Most Rev. Benny Varghese Edathattel as the bishop of Itanagar. The following day, the group

made the arduous journey by road to St. André Parish in the



remote mountain village of Nyapin, where they attended the inauguration of the new St. Jude School and hostel building. It was a special honour for the parish and school community to have the presence of the visiting dignitaries. Next, they travelled back up and down the rugged mountain roads to Holy Cross Parish and School in Koloriang, near the border of China. A highlight of the visit was







when Br. Paul and Br. Nee were vested in traditional tribal attire as part of their welcome.

The General Visitors then journeyed to Guwahati in the state of Assam for a brief visit to our centre at Rani before continuing to Shillong, where they remained for five days at the Moreau Institute of



Integral Training (MIIT). With MIIT as their base, Br. Paul and Br. Nee visited the Holy Cross parishes and schools in the state of Meghalaya, including in Mawkynrew, where they enjoyed a memorable picnic in the hills of the region; Jongksha, where they celebrated the birthday of Fr. Suresh Kagoo, Parish Priest; and Mawpat, the Province's newest mission in the Khasi Hills, where they inaugurated the new presbytery alongside the Most Rev. Wilbert Marwein, Bishop of the Diocese of Nongstoin.

After a visit with the candidates at the formation house in Sumer, Br. Paul and Br. Nee completed their remaining meetings at MIIT. They also conducted an open forum with the members. The Most Rev. Victor Lyngdoh, Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Shillong, also surprised them with a visit.

In one year, the school's enrollment has more than doubled from roughly 400 to over 800, as the school has accepted refugee children from Myanmar who cross the border daily for classes.

On the 20<sup>th</sup> of October, Br. Prodip and Fr. Andrew returned to the state of Tripura, visiting many



parishes and schools in Tripura: Panisagar, Bagbasa, Kumarghat, Kathalcherra, Chailengta, Moharpara, Tuikarmaw, Bodhjungnagar, and Agartala. Among the many highlights was attending Sunday Mass in Kurmapara, a part of St. Paul's Church in Kumarghat.

Once back in Agartala, Br. Prodip and Fr. Andrew met for tea with the Most Rev. Lumen Monteiro,



C.S.C., Bishop of the Diocese of Agartala. They also visited St. André Minor Seminary and Sacred Heart Study House, where they conducted Q-and-A sessions with the candidates. They also visited the Association for Social and Human Advancement (ASHA) and Holy Cross College, Agartala.

On the morning of the 28th of October, four General Visitors met with Fr. Simon and the Provincial





Council, sharing their initial observations. The day ended with a fraternal meal hosted by the Provincial House Community for the General Visitors and area religious and clergy.

**Basile Moreau: A Passionate and Prophetic Life** 

"Receive all that I have written as the outpouring of



a heart which burns with the desire to help you."

"If I can still do you some good, I will do it at once; have no more doubts about it than the sincerity of my love and faithfulness."

The above statements are separated by more than 30 years. They come from a man on fire with love for God, a passion to serve, and a vision for a world that will know better times than ours. The fire that consumed Father Moreau throughout his life and directed his considerable energies was not selfignited. Its kindling was his relationship with and response to God. That fire spread to others and brought Holy Cross into existence that we might be a passionate and prophetic presence in our world.

The fire that guided Father Moreau and illuminated the landscape before him was not self-fuelled. It was kindled and rekindled over his 74 years by those



faith-based values with which he lived every day. Seven values are presented here briefly.

Preeminent among those values is conformity to Jesus Christ. There was no greater priority for Basile Moreau. He consistently and insistently calls us to discover ways in which our daily life, even in its finest details, can reflect Jesus' example and teaching. This is what we are to do and why we are to do it. That conformity will be our greatest glory.

Moreau's trust in providence was unshakable. He believed that just as God had founded Holy Cross, so God would sustain it and bring it to perfection. God is ever-present and always at work, however mundane a particular activity may appear to be. Our cooperation with providence will assure the transforming influence that Holy Cross can have in our world. Zeal distinguished Basile Moreau in every aspect of his life. His passion for ministry and his prophetic stance, whenever fidelity, integrity and justice were threatened by compromise, were ignited by his zeal. He wanted this virtue to be a hallmark of all those who shared with him in this great adventure called Holy Cross.

It was noted by his contemporaries that Father Moreau was especially animated and energized when he spoke about the Eucharist. Through reception of this sacrament and by adoration, our relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist is, from Moreau's perspective, a direct support for all that we are to be and to become as religious of Holy Cross.

The standard for our union in community that Moreau established was nothing less than that for which Jesus prayed in St. John's gospel and that which St. Paul proclaimed to the early Christians. He used the models of the Holy Family and the Holy Trinity to reinforce that. Lived in our community and promoted through our efforts in mission, union with Jesus and union of hearts will be among the most powerful means for transformation at our disposal.

From his experiences, Basile Moreau learned the profound truth of the cross as our only hope. He

trusted that and, as a follower of Jesus, he expected to encounter the cross and he did throughout his life. He was convinced that those encounters held the seeds of resurrection. So too for us, Spes Unica must be more than a proclamation, it must become our liberation, our transformation and, ultimately, our salvation.
