Emmanuel Kallarackal CSC of the Province of North East India, and Br. Prodiplacid Gomes CSC of St. Joseph Province, Bangladesh (SJ), as General Councillors. WAVES congratulates them on their election and wishes them all the best as they serve the Congregation worldwide.

While a lot is happening at the chapter we also have a number of activities going on in our mission

centers. In this issue of WAVES you will find happenings in our parishes, schools and formation houses. Every activity that is happening in the province is an example of our commitment in fulfilling the dream our founder and journeying together with others in hope.

GENERAL CHAPTER 2022

HISTORIC GENERAL CHAPTER 2022 ELECTS BROTHER PAUL BEDNARCZYK, CSC, AS SUPERIOR GENERAL OF THE CONGREGATION OF HOLY CROSS:

History has been created as the General Chapter of the Congregation underway in Rome has elected Brother Paul Bednarczyk, CSC as the first Religious Brother of the Congregation as the New Superior General for a term of six years.



Election of a Religious Brother as the Superior General became possible with the announcement of Pope Francis on May 18th, 2022, about the changes that he had made in the Canon Law relating to the eligibility of the non-ordained member to be named/or elected as the Major Superior of a clerical Institute, including the Superior General.

Congregation of Holy Cross is a religious Congregation composed of two distinct societies of religious, one of the priests and one of the brothers, bound together in one indivisible brotherhood. It has a common founder, tradition, rule, government, way of life, and mission. (C.1, 6)



Brother Paul Bednarczyk belongs to the Moreau Province, with headquarters at Austin, Texas. He professed as a religious of Holy Cross in the year 1979 and served the Church in many capacities. He has served as the Executive Director of the National Religious Vocation Conference (NRVC), USA, consultant to the U.S. Bishops' Committee on Clergy, Consecrated Life and Vocations, member of the Advisory Board of Praesidium Religious Services, the Corporate Board of Holy Cross Family Ministries, and on several international Holy Cross commissions. Currently, for the past six years, Bro. Paul serves as the Vicar General of the Congregation. Brother Paul assumes the leadership in the Congregation at a historical time for the Congregation of Holy Cross.

The Chapter elected Fr. Emmanuel Kallarackal, CSC, of the Province of Northeast India as the priest assistant for the General Council. Bro. Prodip Placid Gomes, CSC was elected as the brother assistant to the general council.

The General Chapter, which began on June 20th, 2022, at Villa Aurelia, Rome, has the theme: "The dream has its time, a journey together in Hope." There are 58 delegates from 16 countries participating in the Chapter deliberations.



The delegates spent the first three days of the Chapter for a time of discernment in which the Chapter delegates listened attentively to the inspiring and eloquent speakers; Cardinal Braz de Aviz, the Prefect of the Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life, Fr. Arturo Sosa S.J. the Superior General of the Society of Jesus and Sr. Roxanne Shares, SSND., the Superior General of the School Sisters of Notre Dame to facilitate this process of discernment.

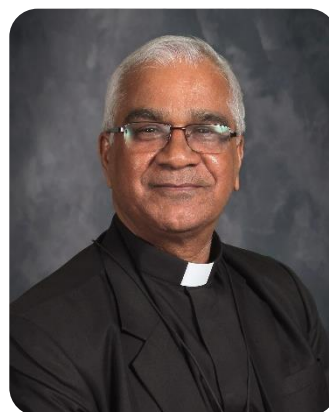
During the last ten days, the chapter capitulants engaged themselves in various sessions on (1)

Governance, (2) Mission and Ministry, (3) Consecrated Life, Heritage, and Charism, (4) Stewardship, and (5) Vocation & Formation. These



sessions deliberated on matters concerning the world, the Church, and the Congregation. On the opening day of the Chapter deliberations, Superior General Fr. Robert Epping, CSC, gave the state of the Congregation and highlighted the agenda items for the consideration of the Chapter. The final week of the Chapter is scheduled for legislative works, which will see decisions that will have far reaching effects on the Congregation and its ministerial commitment throughout the world.

Our congratulations to Fr. Emmanuel Kallarackal CSC, a member of the North-East province, on being elected as the General Councilor. Congratulation, dear Fr. Emma, and our prayerful wishes are with you as you take up this important responsibility in the Congregation.

as a teacher and supervisor. With much enthusiasm, she began her duty; and we wish her every best in her service to the school, and a happy stay as well.



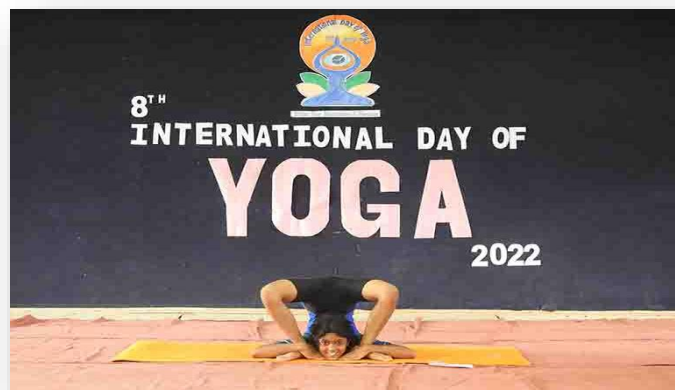
Rabindranath Tagore Jayanti

ORDINATION TO PRIESTHOOD

ORDINATION OF Dn. STEPHEN L. MUNGA CSC:

It is a matter of Rejoicing. Yes, the Province of North East India glorifies God for the gift of another priest in the person of Fr. Stephen Langsianmunga CSC.



Deacon Stephen CSC was ordained a priest on 18th June 2022 at Holy Cross Parish, Champhai, in the Diocese of Aizawl. Most Rev. Stephen Rotluanga CSC, Bishop of Aizawl ordained him in the presence of 26 priests, many of whom were CSCs. Many religious and lay-faithful were also present on the occasion. Despite

incessant rain and dilapidated road-conditions in most parts of the North East, many managed to reach the spot for the event. Bishop Stephen, in his homily, encouraged the newly ordained to work for God's reign with full vigour and with profound commitment. Soon after the sacerdotal ceremony,



a felicitation program was organized in honour of the newly ordained, and needless to say that it all came to an end, with a community Meal. On the

following day, 19th June 2022, Fr. Stephen CSC celebrated his first mass in the same church.



Fr. Stephen Langsianmunga was born on 4th July 1991 in Champhai to Mr. Ngozaakapa and Mrs. Monica Ningngaihluni. He joined Holy Cross as a candidate in 2009 and did his pre-novitiate studies in Holy Cross School, Agartala, Morningstar College,

Shillong and Christ King College, Shillong. After one year of Novitiate formation, he made his first profession on 25th May 2016 in Yercaud, Tamilnadu. He completed his Theological studies at Jnana Deepa Institute of Philosophy and Theology, Pune. On 16th October 2021, Stephen made his perpetual commitment in Holy Cross, at Agartala; and on the following day {17th Oct.'21}, was ordained a deacon by Most Rev. Lumen Monteiro, CSC, Bishop of Agartala Diocese. Fr. Stephen has been assigned for his first ministerial commitment, to Holy Cross Parish, Koloriang, under Itanagar Diocese, Arunachal Pradesh.

The Editorial Team of WAVES met with Fr. Stephen Langsianmunga CSC, and had a conversation with him, regarding his life and ministry.

WAVES: Can you tell us about yourself?

Stephen: I am from Champhai and I belong to Holy Cross Parish under Aizawl Diocese in Mizoram. My Father's name is Ngozakapa, a driver by profession, and my mother, Monica Ningngaihluni, is a home-maker. I have five siblings, comprising 4 brothers and 1 sister. I am the 2nd child in the family. My eldest brother joined Assam Rifles in 2005. He got married in 2017 and has two sons now. My younger sister has already completed her MA and is currently working as a Govt. school teacher. Two of my younger brothers completed their graduation, and my youngest brother is doing his BA first year at the moment.



WAVES: In your experience, what is unique about Holy Cross?

Stephen: My past experiences in Holy Cross have motivated me to become an excellent religious in the Congregation of Holy Cross. I am richly blessed to live with the senior confreres, who are part of my religious-growth. In all my formative years, I have seen different personalities and characters in the form of formators, who have molded me in every way. In all these, I could experience tremendous joy and collaboration with others. Everyone is genuinely gifted, and their creativity has enhanced the community atmosphere. Despite coming from various cultures and languages, I could experience family spirit wherever I was, which enhanced my life to a great extent. I think, therefore, the nature of community life we live is the uniqueness of Holy Cross.

WAVES: In what way, as a Religious Priest, would you like to be SPECIAL?

Stephen: I love visiting families and villages, and I enjoy meeting people and listening to their life-stories. Therefore, as a religious priest, I would very much like to involve more in the pastoral ministry as to be a blessing to the people.

Waves: Who motivated you to choose this way of life?

Stephen: Fr. Thomas John CSC invited and motivated me to join the Congregation of Holy Cross. I am grateful to him for having inspired me to this effect.

A three day Professional Development Program for all the Principals and Headmistresses of our schools

A framework for pedagogical leadership was introduced during the session, supporting principals and headmistresses to develop an "Annual Pedagogical Plan" for their schools.
